## Getting Started

- Once you're signed up, ask a parent to help create your fundraising page and share with family and friends. Top fundraisers win prizes!
- Add books to your bookshelf! Ask your sponsors what their favorite books are. Does your school have a summer reading list? Check out the [Great Starts Reading](#) list.
- Read 20 minutes or more a day. Not only will you build great reading habits but you can win a prize for the most days read with 20 minutes or more!
- Tell your sponsors about Summer Reading Together and how it motivates students to read all summer long. Tell them why you love Learning Ally and want to fundraise.

- Set a goal. You can set an overall fundraising goal, for example \$100, \$500 or more. You can also decide to ask everyone you know for a small amount such as \$5. Sometimes, it's easier to ask a LOT of people for a small amount.
- Say thank you! Don't forget to thank each and every person that supports you and your success.
