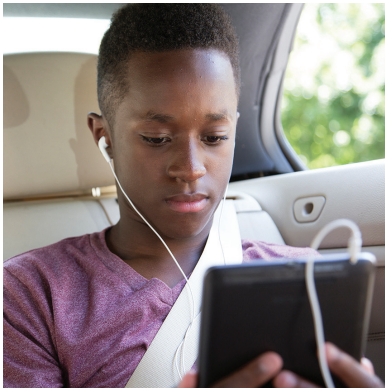

HOW CAN I GET MY 20 MINUTES OF READING WITH LEARNING ALLY AUDIOBOOKS?



- 1 Listen to my audiobooks during snack time.
